How You Can Help

Collect bottle caps at your school and ask students to bring them in from home. ETS will collect these bottle caps from your Technology Liaison Contact (TLC) at their future meetings. The first collection will be at the TLC Meeting on Friday, November 18th at Rock Island PDC.

1,000 bottle caps = 1 Chemo Treatment

Types of Clean Plastic Caps Accepted:

- Caps from threaded neck bottles (soda, water, juice, shampoo, detergent, etc.)
- Plastic Jar Lids (peanut butter, pickles, mayo, etc.)
- Flip caps from tubes, personal care products & food product bottles (condiments, etc.)
- Flexible snap-on lids (butter tub lids, yogurt cup lids, etc.)

Please rinse or clean any remaining 'product' from the caps. Also, please remove foil, foam, or paper liners. Thanks!

Caps NOT accepted:

- Please no caps with foil, foam or paper liners
- Please no dirty caps encrusted with food particles or foreign materials
- Please no metal lids or caps with metal inserts
- Please no plastic pumps or sprayers (they normally have a metal spring hidden in the mechanism or contain more than one type of plastic)

Please no caps or lids that break when bent (possibly indicates polystyrene PS #6 or other brittle plastic that would contaminate or ruin the entire batch)
